Population Figures

Population figures for all entries must be taken from the electoral roll, so that there is uniformity amongst entries.

The electoral roll figure for your entry includes all wards within boundary of your village, town or city.

This information can be obtained from your county planning department, where a research officer (demographer) has responsibility for the various uses of population figures.

In addition, for entries with a population in excess of 2,500, a map showing the boundaries of all the urban ward(s) which comprise your entry, and the name(s) of the ward(s) which comprise your entry, should be included with your entry form.

This information will be held and used for future entries for a period of five years or until significant changes of boundaries or population occurs.

Judging 2011

Judging will take place in the fortnight between Wednesday 6th July & Wednesday 20th July. You will be contacted during May to arrange your visit.

The closing date for both the SW in Bloom competition and the IT's Your Neighbourhood has been brought forward to help entries in arranging their judging tour earlier.
